Spring CDE season is ending and our Peebles FFA teams have enjoyed every minute of their contests, practices, and bus rides. They have competed at the Marysville Invitational on March 8, the District Contest at Miami Trace on March 15, and the State Contest on March 29 and have done exceptionally well this season!

The livestock judging team consists of Katie McFarland, Callie Ralston, Clay Brown, Noah Ward, A.J. Cluxton, Tyler Ryan, Sarah McFarland, Lexy Smart, Brooklyn Farmer, and Jordan Crum.

The poultry judging team consists of Morgan Brown, Joe McElwee, Raegan Dick, and Katie Cora.

The equine management team consists of Jessica Shelton and C.J. Smart.

At the Marysville contest, the general livestock judging team placed 9th, and A.J. Cluxton was the 3rd highest individual out of 445. The poultry judging team was 5th, and Morgan Brown was 13th place out of 87 individuals. The equine management team did not have a full team to place in this contest.

At the District contest, the general livestock judging team placed 2nd. Noah Ward was 3rd highest individual, Tyler Ryan was 10th, and Katie McFarland was 13th out of 334 individuals. The poultry judging team was 4th, Morgan Brown was the 6th highest individual and Katie Cora was 18th out of 81 individuals. The equine management team received 29th place out of 42 teams and C.J. Smart was the 12th highest individual out of 156 students.

At the State contest, the general livestock judging team placed 3rd;
Tyler Ryan was the 9th place individual and Katie McFarland was 23rd out of 1092 students. The poultry judging team was also 3rd; Morgan Brown was the 4th highest individual, Raegan Dick was 16th, Joe McElwee was 20th, and Katie Cora was 48th out of 279. C.J. Smart competed in the equine management contest and was 133 out of 449. Both the Poultry and General Livestock Judging teams will be competing in the State Finals Contest on April 30th. Congratulations to everybody that judged this season and thanks for all of your dedication!
