

Members utilized the broiler project for SAE's, classroom lessons and after school FFA work hours. Many members were able to take part in daily care such as feeding, watering, health checks & pen cleaning. This is our chapters only project where members are able to see the full production cycle from start to finish, therefore serving as a great learning experience. Members participated in assisting in the slaughter and cleaning of the 61 broilers. Members learned to clean out the vis-

ceral organs, de-tip/de-leg and understand the importance of utilizing proper harvesting techniques in small livestock.

















# November 2019 Broiler Processing



Once birds were harvested, members returned to the school to further process the meat into wings, legs, thighs, breasts & breast tenderloins. Our birds weights varied between 7-12lbs live and weighed from 5-9lbs dressed. Members were able to secure over 700 pieces of meat which weighed in at approximately 300lbs of for our Annual FFA Banquet Meal in May. Our Poultry CDE team was able to use this experience as practice for the Ready to Cook Carcass Placing Class and the Carcass Parts identification Class to prepare for the Poultry Contest. Members were able to gain valuable hands on experience about production, harvesting and processing of a commodity and had a great time learning about the entire process from farm to table, all of this is information that they will use as future consumers.
