## District Soil ciers

The District 9 Rural Soils Judging Contest was held on October 1st in Highland County. Participants test their skills against students from other schools as they contended in either, Agricultural Soil Judging or Urban Soil Judging. Participants in both Agricultural and Urban Soil CDE's evaluated the soil based on specific features such as Slope, Landform/position, Flood hazard, Soil stability, Soil texture at the surface, subsoil and substratum levels, Drainage class, Depth to restrictive features, Depth to bedrock, Degree of limitations and Best Management Practices.

The Agricultural Soils CDE is composed of completing a general soil knowledge test, a soil survey test and evaluating four soil pits to make decisions when faced with soil related issues that affect agricultural production.

## The Urban Soils CDE

 is composed of completing a general soil knowledge test, a soil survey test and evaluating four soil pits to determine its potential use for urban, home site, and other nonfarm uses and development.

## Exotic Feline Rescue Tour

Exotic Feline Rescue Center on Friday, November 1st while attending National FFA convention in Indianapolis, IN. The visit to the Rescue Center allowed FFA members to gain knowledge on the zoological industry while experiencing it first-hand. When the members arrived they were able to learn about the center's daily operations. The tour exposed members to the plight of endangered cats in captivity and the wild. Members were able to view several species of cats including lions, tigers, pumas, leopards, bobcats, and servals in their large natural habitats. They learned all about these beautiful cats including their history, veterinary care, diets, likes, dislikes, and instinctive behaviors.

Members were given the opportunity to learn about Apple and Pumpkin production by exploring the farm in areas such as the pumpkin patch, the apple orchard, the apple cider press and much more. Members were able to speak with the Marketing Manager as he discussed business aspects of the farm, as well as how he became such a young marketing manager.
