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## Chicken Sleughter

The students in the Animal Science and Technology class started off the annual chicken project with 100 birds. Students prepared an enclosure for the chicks before they arrived on September $20^{\text {th }}$. While in class, the students were given the tasks of feeding, watering, and maintaining the chickens' facility on a daily basis. During this process, the students were provided with the opportunity to see an agricultural product from start to finish, as well as having the satisfaction of completing the assignment. 95 of the original 100 birds were slaughtered and processed on November $9^{\text {th }}$ at the high school. The meat from these chickens will be used at the Annual Peebles FFA Awards Banquet as well as the chapter's Community Appreciation Dinner that will be in mid-February 2014.


Members of the Peebles FFA chapter attended a State FFA Leadership Night on November 13th at Laurel Oaks Technical Center in Wilmington. Freshmen, sophomore, and junior members attended leadership sessions with the Ohio FFA Association Officers and seniors attended business and industry sessions to help prepare them for their future endeavors. Attendees learned about seeing the good in themselves as well as others and how to focus on the big picture. At the end of the night members made a plan to include more of the chapter members in the planning in activities to utilize their strengths. Many State Officers were there to help conduct this workshop. All who attended enjoyed themselves and gained valuable leadership skills.
