## National FFA Week

This years National FFA Week was held on February 16th-22nd. The purpose of FFA Week is to educate the public about agriculture. During the week, we hosted a teacher appreciation luncheon, conducted "Hot Tamale" voting polls, made public service announcements on the radio about FFA, and raised money for the charity of our choice with the National Honor Society.

Our chapter's community service fundraiser for the week was raising money for Pennies for Patients. In order to educate students on Pennies for Patients, we set up a display in the cafeteria in which students could walk up to and read facts about Pennies for Patients. To raise money, our chapter invented a contest in which teachers volunteered to become a cow for a day. The participating teachers' names were placed on a box and then set out in the cafeteria so students could put money in the box for the teacher of their choice. At the end of the month the two teachers with the most money in their jar had to wear cow suits for the whole day on Friday, February 28. To keep track of how much money each teacher has, the officers recorded the totals on pennies that were placed next to the facts about Pennies for Patients.
