Adams County Fair

Adams County Fair was held the week of July 10th and ran through July 16th. A lot of preparation went into our fair week. the county. Fair week kicked off on Sunday, with the parade in the evening which is then followed by the Queens' Contest, where the royalty for the week is crowned. 


