# SUMMER ACTIVITIES

The summer of 1982 was a very busy one for Peebles FFA members. The Chapter has a farming program consisting of 55 acres of corn, 130 acres of soybeans, 37 acres of wheat, 1 acre of tobacco, 75 acres of pasture, 32 beef cattle, 46 sheep, and a swine breeding herd. The care of these projects was an extensive job and several members worked nearly full time this summer helping with them.

A total of 55 members exhibited projects at the Adams County Fair in July. Numerous prizes were won and the chapter's dairy judging team placed first in the County and the general livestock team placed second in beef judging. Many of the members won County prizes, such as Darren White, who placed first in the tobacco show. A total of 11 members attended FFA Camp near Carrollton, Ohio in northeastern Ohio. This was a five-day camp where the members enjoyed a variety of recreation, leadership training, and conservation education.

Ten of the chapter's members were invited to present demonstrations at the Ohio State Fair. These students gave presentations on a rotational basis for over seven hours in front of several hundred people. FFA Chapter Queen Melissa Austin competed in the Adams County Junior Fair Queen Contest, and past-chapter Queen Ruth Austin competed in the Ohio State FFA Queen Contest in Columbus.

The Chapter held a swimming party at Woodland Altars Camp and they took a trip to Kings Island as recreational activities. Ten of the members went on a special tobacco seed production tour at Clay's Seed Farms in Kentucky. The group also visited a large race horse breeding farm. Several members went to the Adams County Dairy Production Field Day and two of them placed first and second in the judging contest.

Several members assisted with projects of the Peebles Young Farmers and Wives as well as being an active part of the Greenhorns and other 4-H Clubs.

Since school has begun the group has helped with the County Beef Barbecue at the fairgrounds, has participated in the Adams County Soil & Water Conservation Field Day, has worked extensively with the Old Timer's Days festival, and has attended the Farm Science Review.

## FARM SCIENCE REVIEW

Forty-Three members of the Peebles FFA Chapter went to Columbus on September 21 to attend the Farm Science Review at the Ohio State University's Don Scott Airport Farms. Over thirty million dollars in farm machinery and equipment were on display and being demonstrated. The students were also able to see livestock exhibits and talk to dealers about various new products.

## FFA ACTIVE IN OLD TIMER'S DAYS FESTIVAL

The Peebles FFA Chapter was extensively involved in the Old Timer's Days Festival. The biggest project was the livestock display, which was constructed for people to view and children to pet. The display included two pens of geese, one duck, one pen of guineas, a game rooster, five pens of chickens, two pens of rabbits, a large goat, a small goat, two pigs, two lambs, and a dairy calf. The group gave presentations to five different elementary classes and the children played with the animals.

Three of the members served as official Queen escorts in the Queen Pageant. Four members were responsible for running the wagon shuttle from the Main Street area to the Farm Tractor Pull area on the east end of town. Several members "spotted" the 500 pound weights used in the tractor pull by placing them on the pulling sled when needed.

Many members helped set up the events, remove materials, and assist with contests. The group built the steps which were used at the new festival stage. They helped with the Young Farmers and Wives' Pig Scramble and the FFA Alumni's Pig Races. Several members participated in the Parade and a number of them were involved in clean-up after the festival. FFA Queen, Melissa Austin, was named Second Runner-Up in the Queen Pageant.



Both the Reserve and Varsity Cheerleading Squads attended the Elite Cheerleading Camp in Wilmington, Ohio. Both squads received ribbons for participating throughout the week. In July, the cheerleaders got together for a fund day at Long's Retreat. They went swimming and had a picnic.

In September the cheerleaders held a raffle during Old Timer's Days. The prizes were: (1) Sugar 'n' Spice painting, donated by Gloria Ryan; (2) a plant donated by Peebles Flower Shop; and (3) a T-shirt, donated by T-Shirts 'n' Such. The raffle winners were:

The Cheerleaders will be sponsoring a dance on October 29, 1982, featuring music by "CHAOS". The dance will be held in the Peebles High School Gym.

## AUTUMN

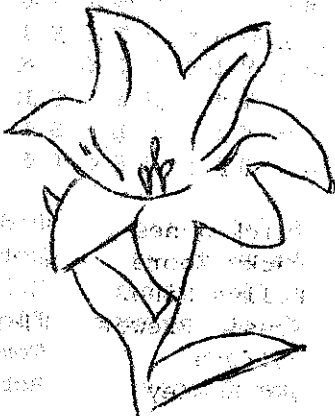
Autumn is that time of year,
