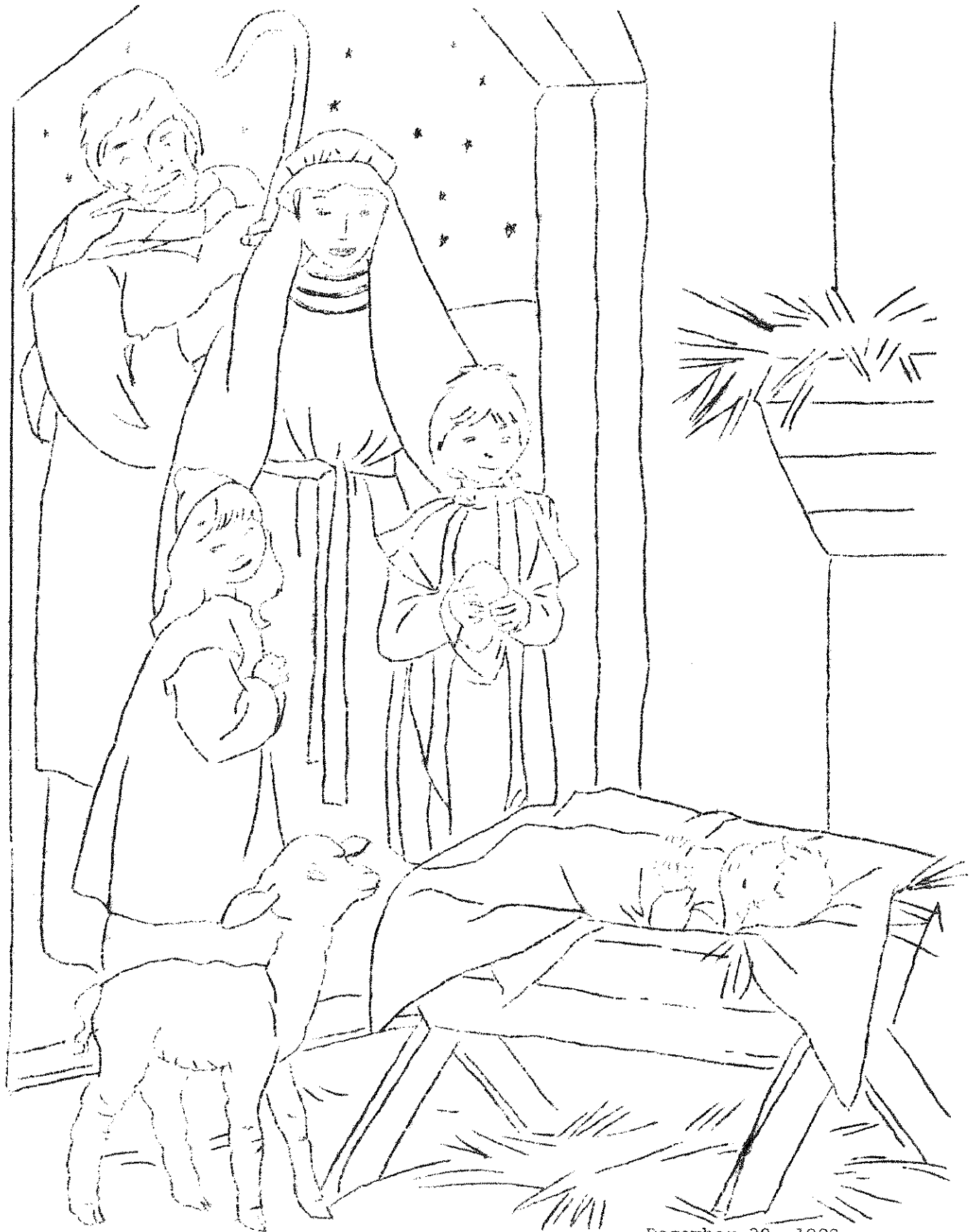

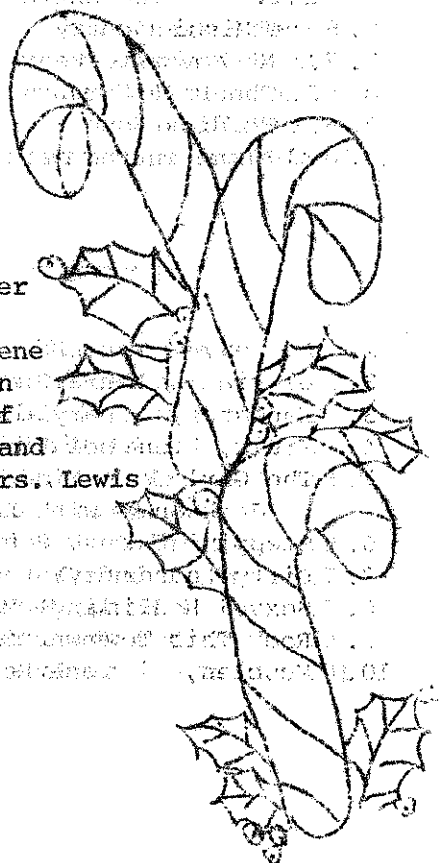
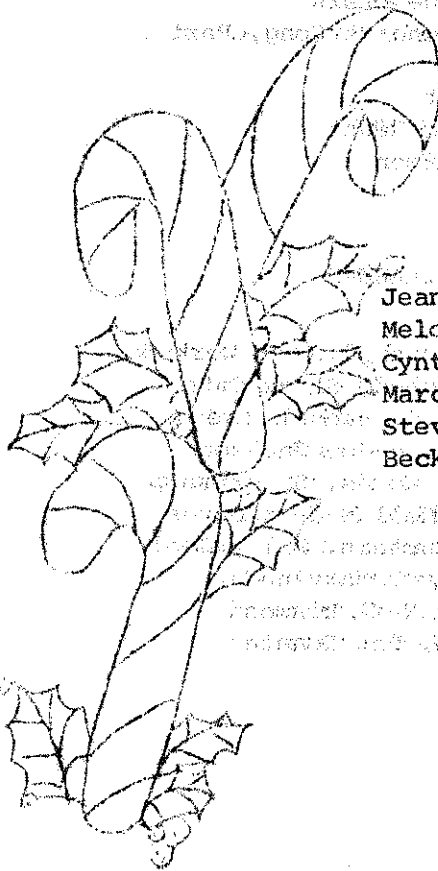

We hear Angie T. has a good chance of starring in the new Rocky IV movie. After all, she has been getting some practice.

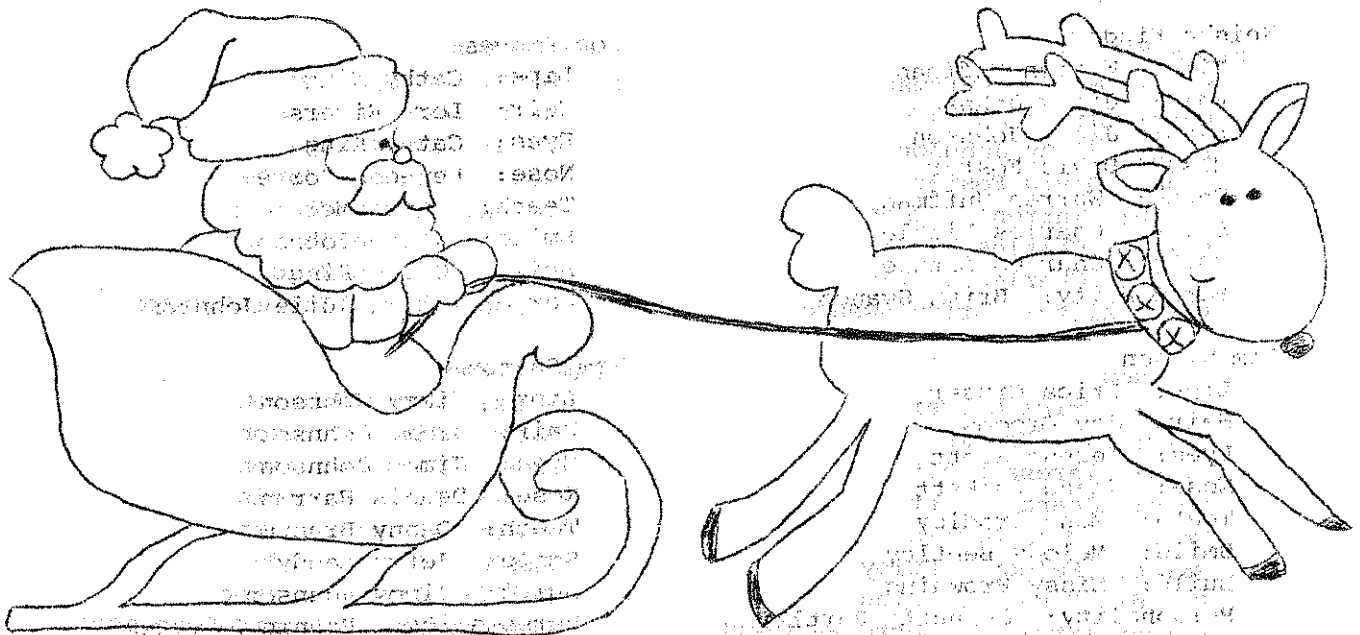

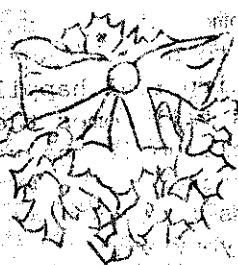
MEMORIES

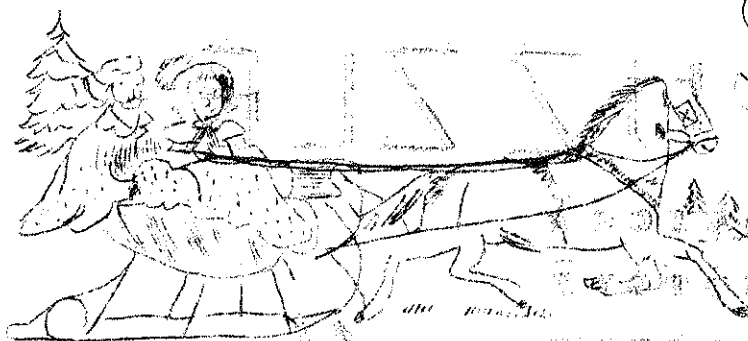

The Peebles Indian Boys' teams began their season this month. The Varsity started things off right with a victory over Manchester in the Preview.

They then proceeded to face the Dragons of West Union. Again the Mighty Men prevailed victorious, winning by 34 points, with the final score being 66-32. Bret Newman took scoring honors, tallying 14 points. The Reserve were also victorious, winning 48-37.

The next opponent for the Mighty Men were the Indians of Lucasville Valley. The Mighty Men hailed yet another victory, winning 76-35. Mark McKenzie took scoring honors. The Reserve suffered their first loss of the season to the young Valley Indians, with a score of 31-30.

On Friday, December 10, the Indians traveled to Fayetteville and defeated the Rockets by the final score of 87-55. Bret Newman tallied 19 for the winners. The Peebles Reserve squad improved its record (two and one), with a 64-25 victory.

The Indians made it four in a row on Tuesday, December 14 against the Portsmouth Clay Panthers. It was a hard fought battle, but the Indians prevailed by a score of 56-43. Mark McKenzie had 19 for the winners. The Reserve team posted their third win of the season with a 38-36 victory.

The classes include crops of ear corn, shelled corn, tobacco, hay, and soybeans.

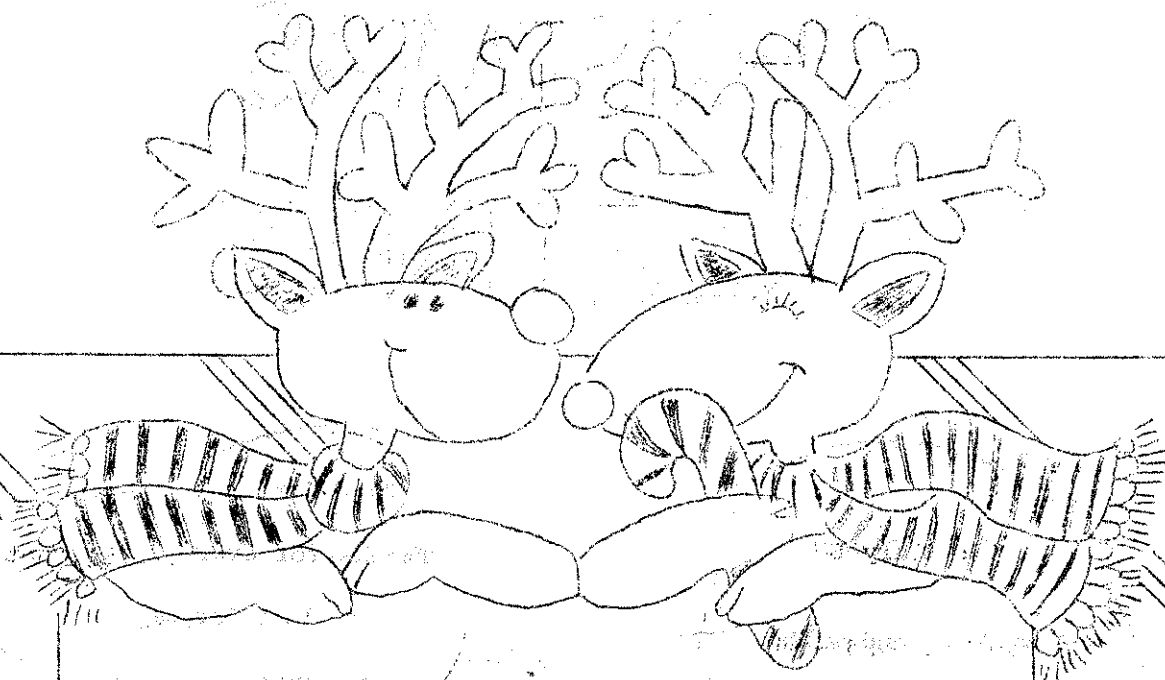
The homemaking classes are Christmas tree ornaments, Christmas candy, and cheese balls.

2 tablespoons soy sauce

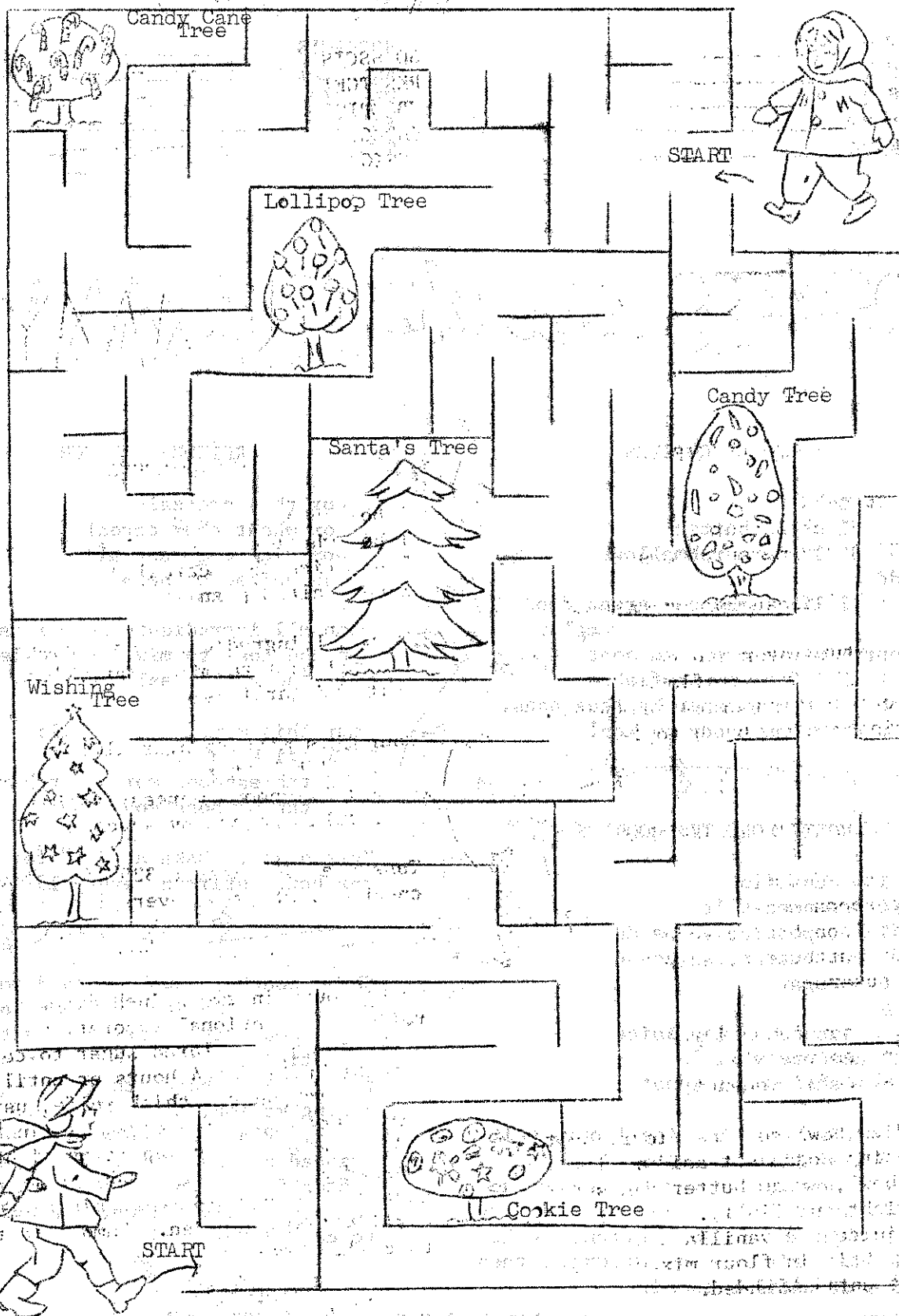
Toss again. Bake at 325° for about

From that day on, every year about this time, his memory comes into homes all over the world as stories are told and stockings are filled and good cheer is brought to all, both young and old.

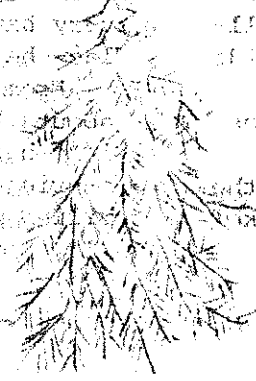
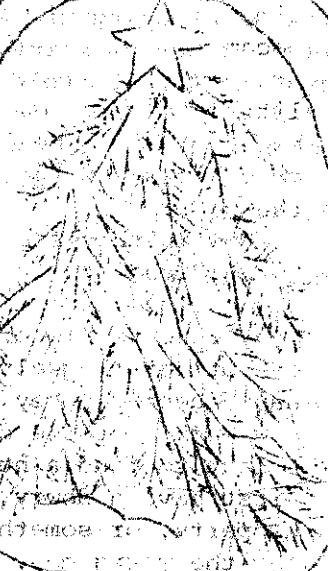
