They're legwarmers. And they're very popular with the younger generation. Especially teenage and college students.

But, exactly what are legwarmers? And why does everyone like them so much all of a sudden?

Well, legwarmers are just that—legwarmers, and although they come in various colors and styles, they were originally meant to keep the legs warm.

Why does everyone like them so much? That's hard to say, but a good guess would be both fad and fashion. Most people wear legwarmers because it's the latest fad. But, there's something to be said for fashion too. Legwarmers can add just the right touch to that new outfit or make the most of an old one.

In any case, for now, legwarmers are one of the "in" things to wear. So let's hear it for legwarmers!

## ACCENT ON EYES

Do you often think your eyes are too wide, too small, or hardly visible at all?

Well, here's some tips to help correct those problems.

To make your eyes stand out, highlight! Use darker shadow on your lower lid, then highlight by using a lighter shadow above the crease. A medium shade in between the darker and lighter shades may be helpful too. Maybelline Blooming Colors eye shadow is a big plus when highlighting. It contains dark, light, and medium colors and highlighting is explained on the package.

For wide-set eyes, a lighter shade in the middle and toward the outer edge should be used. This should help correct the problem.

For eyes that seem too small, don't use dark colors. Use light or medium shades. Also, when applying blush, brush some along the cheekbone, then form an angle by brushing vertically beside eyes (on temples). Mascara is a big help too. Mascara with a curl brush makes the eyes stand out more. Maybelline Magic Mascara is a good choice.

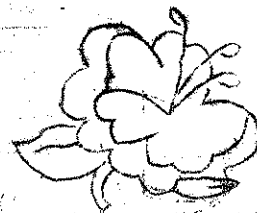

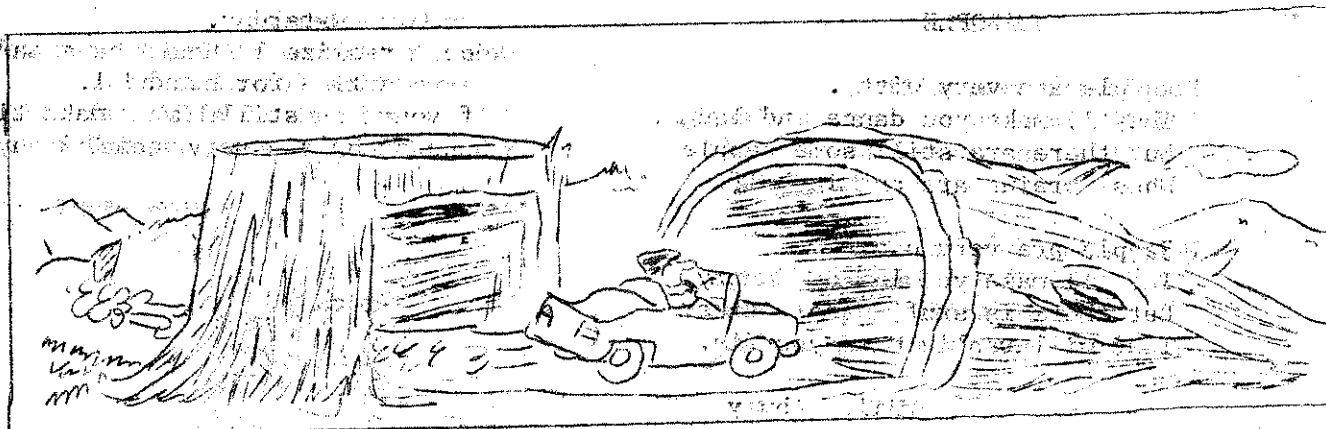
# MOVIE REVIEWS

**48 HOURS:** Nick Nolte and Eddie Murphy tend to give this movie a good dose of drama with just the right amount of comedy. Nolte plays a detective out on the prowl for cop-killers with only a convict (Murphy) to give him any leads. The prison lends Murphy to Nolte for 48 hours; the time limit that Nolte's boss gave him to catch the killers. Plenty of blood and "Rough 'em up". Strong language and some nudity. Rated R.

**THE TOY:** Jackie Gleason portrays an arrogant father who thinks money can buy anything, including his son's, Eric's, love. Eric, of course, thinks just the opposite and to make his father mad, demands a human as a birthday present. The human, played by Richard Pryor, is funny, entertaining, and guaranteed to keep you rolling in the aisles. Rated PG.

**CREEPSHOW:** (Stephen King) Five different supernatural tales of horror and revenge. Contains everything necessary for a night of frights. Filled with situations in which people get their revenge. One example: two people buried in the sand, watch in terror as the waves begin to wash over their heads. Rated R.

**HONKYTONK MAN:** Story about a 14-year old boy and his uncle, who is a country singer. The two leave depression-era Oklahoma to go to Nashville. The boy feels guilty because he knows his parents wouldn't approve of his uncle's actions, but his parent are "poor and beaten by life" and his uncle (Clint Eastwood) is somebody special. Rated R.

however, Ozzy canned part of his band. His replacements were Tommy Aldridge on drums and Rudy Sarzo on bass. With this he released, "Diary of a Madman," and began touring again.

While filling concert halls all across the U.S. people began to get the impression that Ozzy would never be a "Rock-n-Roll has been". It looked like he would be king of the mountain at last.

But in March of 1982 tragedy struck. Randy Roads was killed in a bizarre plane crash. Many people wondered if Ozzy would be able to continue after Randy's untimely death. Ozzy said that it was a great loss and he didn't know if he'd perform again. But he took some time off, regrouped, and began touring again.

Now Ozzy has been voted the #1 rock act in America. And with the release of a new live album "Speak of the Devil" (featuring Brad Gillis of 'Nightranger' on guitar), it appears that he'll remain #1 for a while.

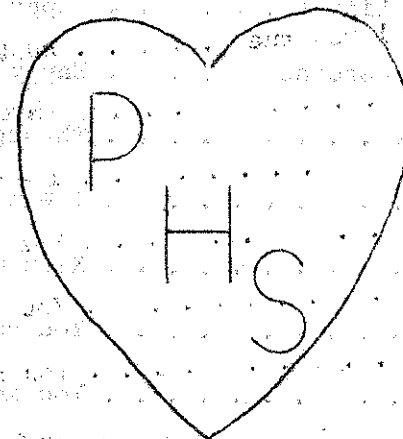

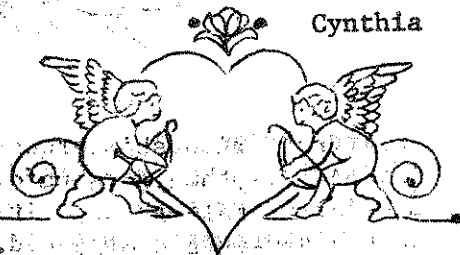
