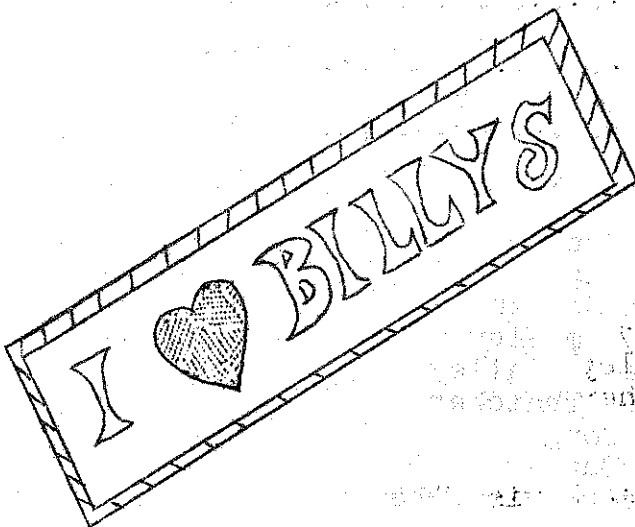

FFA AT LEADERSHIP-CITIZENSHIP DAY

Rob Daniels, President of the Peebles FFA Chapter and Vocational Agriculture instructor James Fause met with the Honorable Cooper Snyder, member of the 115th Ohio General Assembly at the FFA "Salute to the Ohio Legislature" breakfast in Columbus on February 2, 1983.

Dr. James E. Cummins, director of the Ohio Agriculture Education Service and the State Officers of the Ohio FFA Association informed Ohio's legislators and leaders in education and agriculture about the Agricultural Education programs being conducted on local, city, and joint vocational school districts to train individuals for occupations in the agriculture industry.

The FFA members and their vocational agriculture teachers spent the day touring the State Capital and the Ohio Supreme Court, attending sessions of the Senate and the House of Representatives and committee hearings on proposed legislation.

This activity was sponsored by the Ohio FFA Association and the Ohio Vocational Agriculture Teacher's Association.



WINS AWARDS

The District 12 FFA Evaluation was held on February 8 at Blanchester High School in Clinton County. All FFA Chapters in the District submitted their applications for awards in chapter competition, officer competition, and individual student state degrees and proficiency award competition. There are six areas in which chapters can compete and the Peebles chapter filed applications in each one. The Peebles chapter placed second in the area of Cooperation Activities and won a plaque. The Chapter placed third in the area of Marketing and won a plaque. Peebles placed third in the Chapter Tobacco Production and Promotion area and received a plaque. The chapter placed fourth in safety and was one of seven chapters eligible for state competition in the area of Community Service.

The Peebles Chapter was rated Superior for its overall Program of Activities and will be judged at the State level to determine if it will receive the Gold Medal Award.

In the officer competition, LeAnn Hemming placed fourth with her Scrapbook and received a Gold rating. Tim Howe placed fourth in the Treasurer's competition and rated Gold. Pat Lloyd placed seventh in the Secretary's award and received a silver rating. Darren White placed sixth in the student tobacco award competition and will receive a gold pin.

HAIR CARE NIKES

When expert Leslie Blanchard set out to develop his new line of hair care products, he realized the importance of a few hair care facts that aren't widely known.

Most hair damage comes from improperly drying your hair. The least damaging method, of course, is to wrap your hair in a towel to get rid of excess moisture, then comb it out and let it air-dry. Since there isn't always time for this, Mr. Blanchard suggests the following compromise: partially towel-dry your hair, and finish with a blow-dryer set no higher than "warm" and held at least six inches away from your hair.

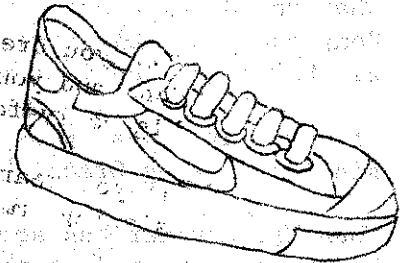
The best way to condition your hair is to apply a conditioning lotion plus heat. To do this at home, apply conditioner before going into the shower, put on a shower cap and let the warm, steamy air speed up the process. Or sit under a hooded dryer (set on warm) for ten minutes; or wrap a hot, damp towel around your head after applying conditioner and leave it on for 15 minutes, then rinse with cool water.

Color-treated or permed hair needs very gentle care. Standard shampoos and conditioners can cause the color to change or the perm to relax, so be sure to look for products specially formulated for use on chemically treated hair.

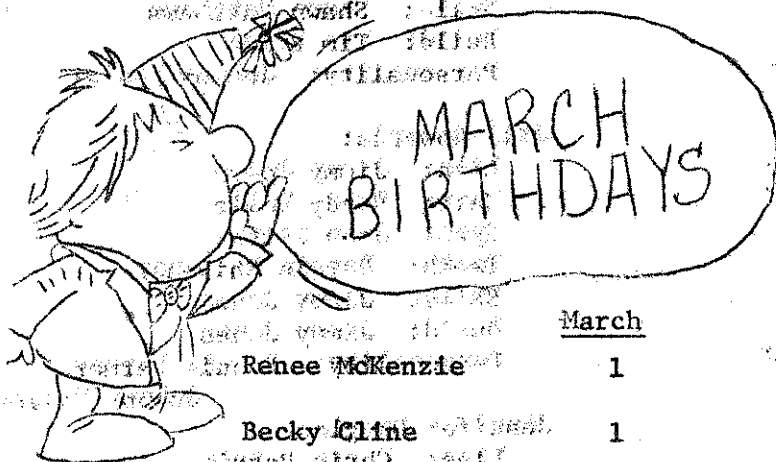

LET'S SPEND THE NIGHT TOGETHER

This movie, as the title suggests, features the Rolling Stones. The movie is made from a series of 1981 Stones concerts. The music, of course, is good. 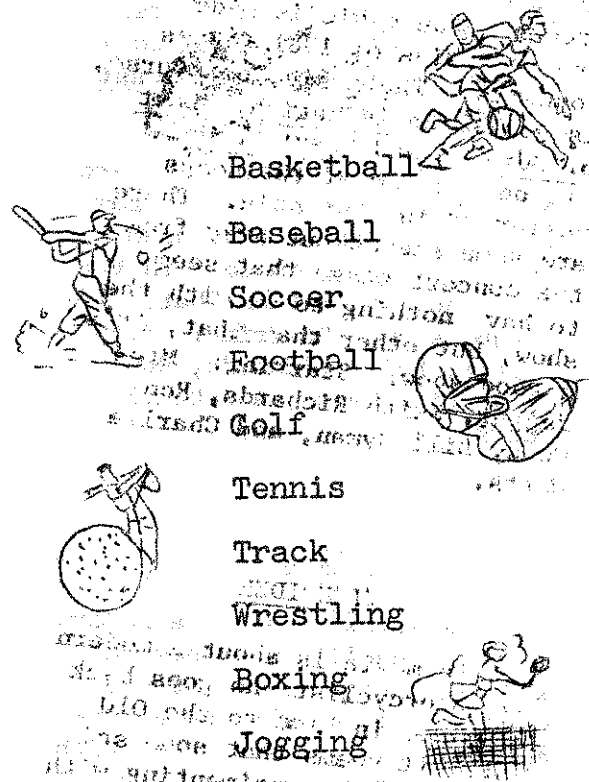
