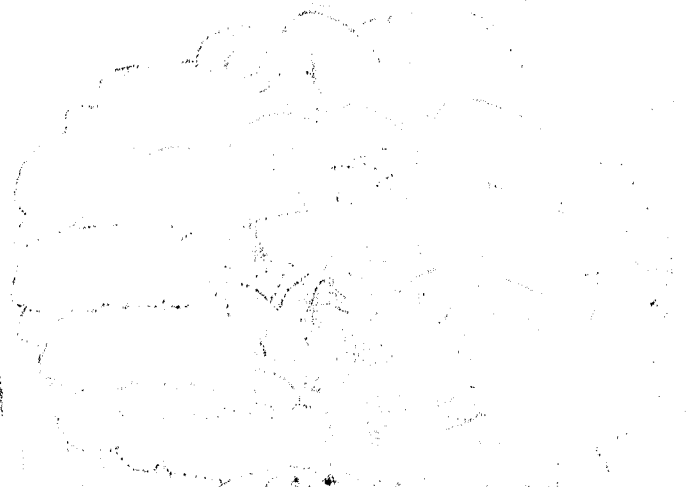

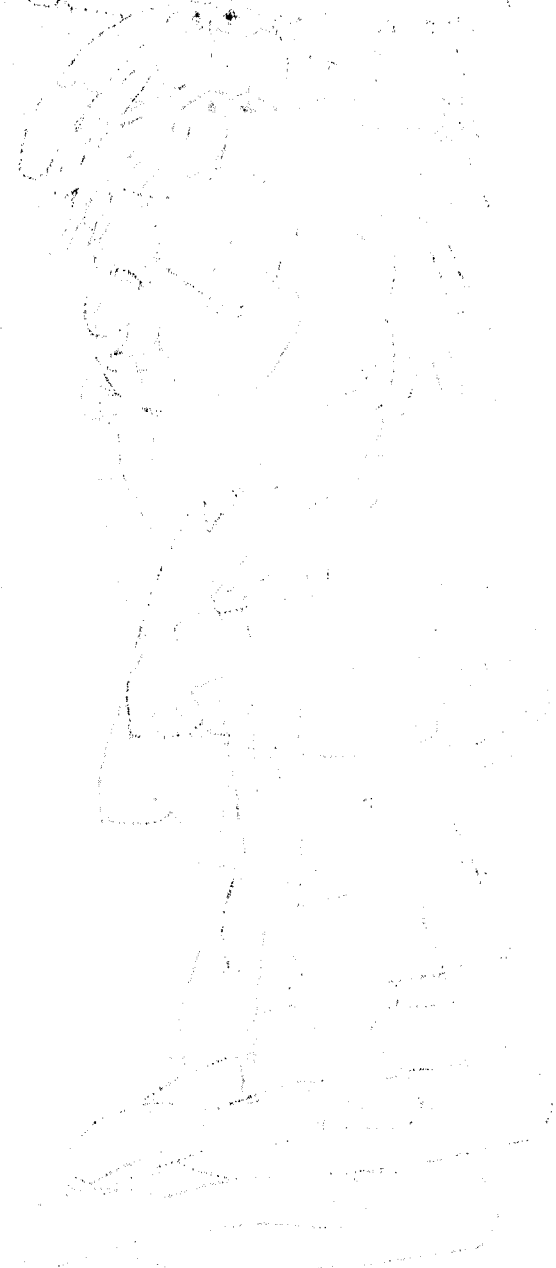

The World Won't Stop For You

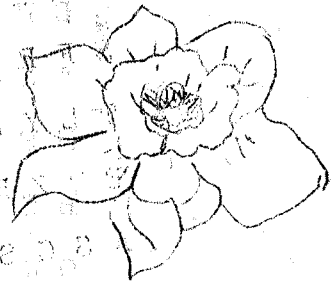
Our good times simply faded,

Barth and Osbourne got nowhere fast playing in bands like Canary and Wakefield on the Colorado bar circuit. They met Riley and Milwaukee-born Mueller in Los Angeles, formed a band called Baby Face and relocated in Wisconsin. It wasn't until the group split up, reformed and relocated in Gainesville, Florida, that things started to look up.

Instead of working the area's club scene, the new band moved into a converted warehouse and made demo tapes designed to impress the record companies. The group became AXE in 1978 and began working as a live band once again. The hard-rockers are finally getting some national attention with their third album, OFFERING. They have been touring the country opening for acts like Judas Priest and Iron Maiden.

VANDENBERG

The latest entry in the rock and roll "greatest guitarists" contest is Adrian Vandenberg, leader of the Dutch hard-rock band that bears his surname. Adje, as his friends call

him, has played sessions with other bands back home, but now the new band is aiming to take on the world.

When his previous group broke up, Adrian did nothing. A year later, he decided to get back into making music. He sought out a singer he had once seen performing Led Zeppelin in Uriah Heep songs. He tracked down Bet Herrink, who hadn't sung in four years and was repairing vacuum cleaners and TV sets. Once they began jamming with bassist Dick Kemper and drummer Jos Zoomer, they knew they had a winning combination. The group is represented in the U.S. with a self-titled debut album.
