FFA ELECTS OFFICERS

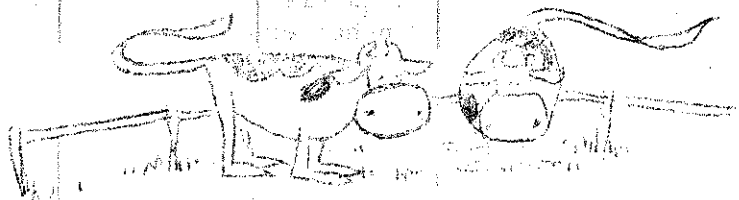

The official timber cruising team was made up of Tim Foster and Donnie Free, with John Savage as alternate. Kristi Stratton and Bill Dulaney were the members of the lumber grading team.

Timber cruising requires students to identify trees, measure the log capacity, and compute the value of the timber. Lumber grading requires both species identification of sawed lumber as well as placing a market grade on each board.

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ADAMS COUNTY HISTORY

The Adams County History class went on their third field trip on Friday, October 7. On this field trip the class visited five old landmarks: The Thomas Kirker Homestead, located on State Rt. 136 in Liberty Township and built by Thomas Lirder in 1805; Treber's Inn, located on State Rt. 41 in Tiffin Township, was built by John Treber in 1798; The Andrew Ellison home, built by Andrew Ellison in 1798, is located on Logan Lane in northern Tiffin Township. This is probably the oldest stone structure in Ohio. Daniel Collier built his log house in 1802; it is now owned by his great granddaughter, Hattie Osman. The house is located on Spurgeon Hill Road in Tiffin Township. We also visited the Kirker Covered Bridge on State Rt. 136 in Liberty Township.

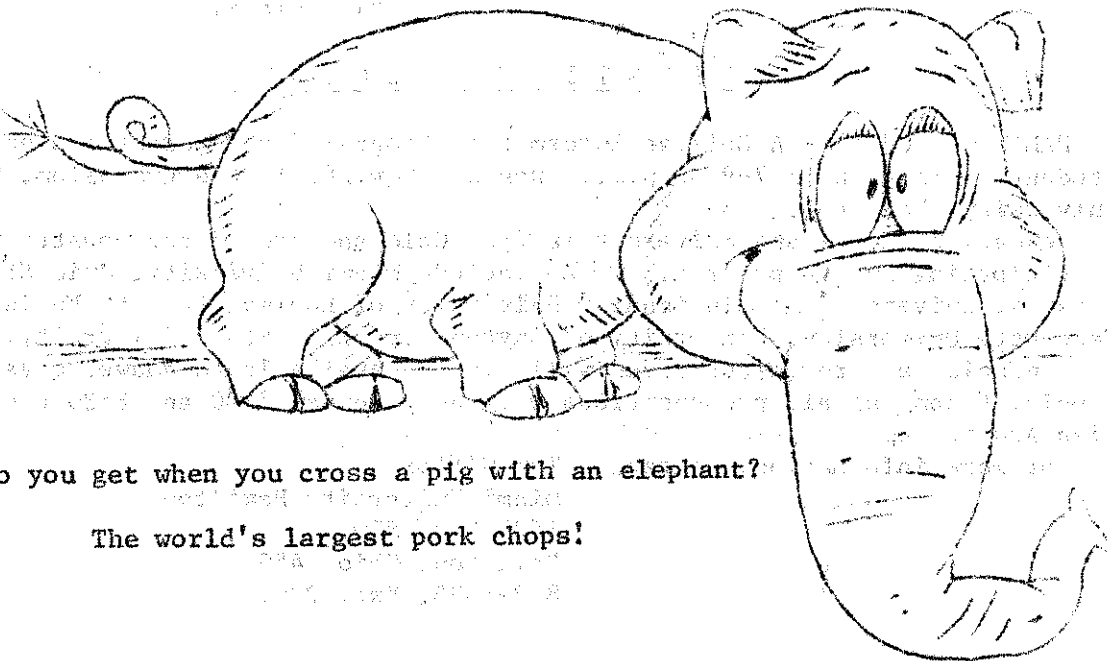

MOVIE REVIEWS

EASY MONEY: Rodney Dangerfield stars as sleazy Monty Capuletti, a slob who must drop all his beloved bad habits within a year for his family to inherit his mother-in-law's \$10 million inheritance. In this film, Dangerfield is a funny man saddled with mostly plodding, tasteless material.

MR. MOM: Michael Keaton and Teri Garr star in this predictable role-reversal comedy, bringing more humor and life to the story than its script deserves. The situation is strictly TV sitcom, but the performances are charming.

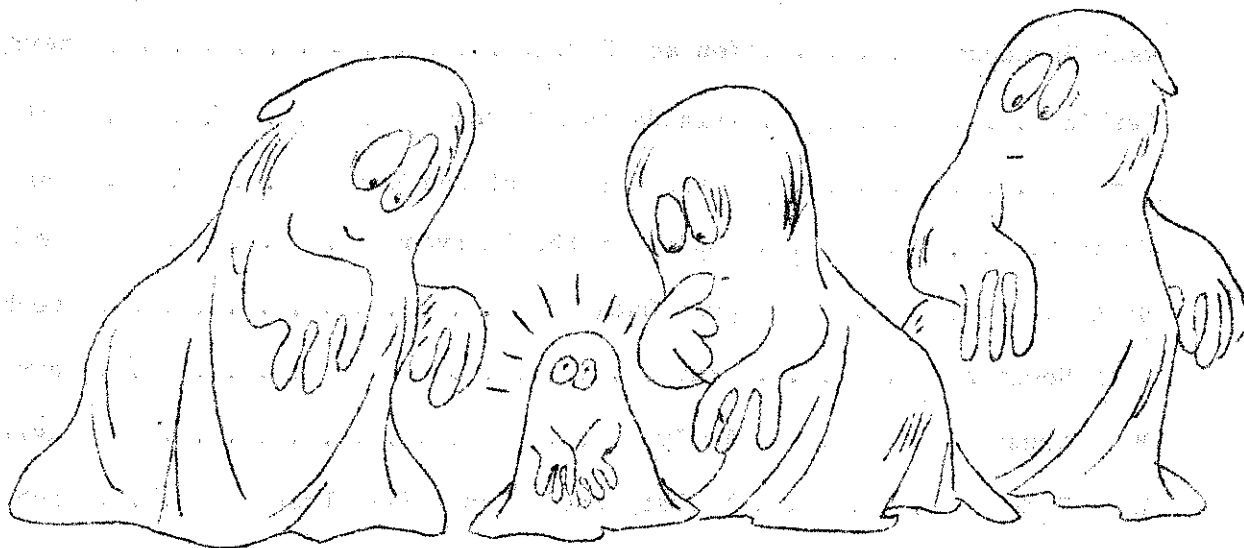
The Boys Preview will be held at Peebles on November 18. The Girls Preview will be held at West Union on November 19.

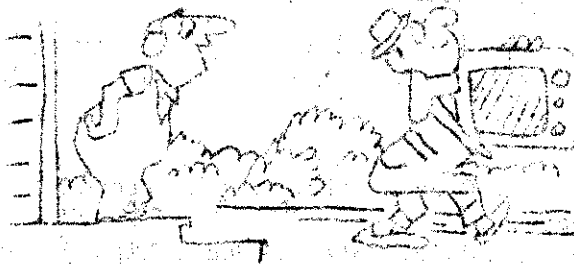
