

The Peebles FFA Chapter will receive the National Silver Emblem Award at the National FFA Convention in Kansas City, Missouri on November 10. This award is one of the highest honors an FFA Chapter can receive. In order for an FFA Chapter to be eligible for a National Emblem it must be rated superior at the District level and also be ranked as one of the top chapters at the state level. Each state then submits its top chapters for National level competition and the National ratings of Gold, Silver, or Bronze are presented at the National Convention.

The Peebles Chapter received the National Gold Emblem twice in the past, the National Silver Emblem twice, and the National Bronze Emblem once. Ratings are based on the total overall Program of Activities of the FFA Chapter, its quality, and its overall member participation in numerous activities.



MOVIE REVIEWS

RICHARD PRYOR-HERE AND NOW: Richard

Pryor does what he knows best--stand-up comedy. It was filmed at the Saenger Theater in New Orleans, and is a comedy smash.

RUMBLE FISH: A marvelous movie, surreal yet understandable, about a young street kid's tough struggle for respect. Filmed in black and white, but lush in its delivery; based on a book by . E. Hinton

THE DEAD ZONE: Christopher Walden

helps to make this more than cheap chills; it's actually a sensitive, scary, atmospheric story about a psychic who can change the future.

UNDER FIRE: Under average. An entertaining, but misguided tale about three journalists who find themselves embroiled in a South American revolution and a menage a trois. Gritty and realistic at first, it kills itself off by going for a saccharine John Wayne ending.

THE RIGHT STUFF: Part history lesson,

part satire, all-American. A sweeping epic about the Mercury astronauts and the space race, this is more than an adventure; it's a portrait of our country.

THE GREY FOX: A portrait of Bill Miner, a famous stagecoach robber. This is no shoot-'em-up western, but a funny, sensitive, well-scripted character study, with a beautifully shaded portrayal of Miner by Richard Farnsworth.

THE RETURN OF MARTIN GUERRE: A man

returns to his village, and his sensuous wife, after a nine-year absence. Or does he? Some of his friends say the man is an imposter, and he is brought to trial to prove his real identity. Based on a true story from 16th century France. French, with subtitles.

BRAINSTORM: A team of scientists develops the ultimate in electronic thrills--a device which can record the experiences of one human being and transmit them to another, in Technicolor and Dolby sound, yet. A fine cast-including the late Natalie Wood in her final performance, and remarkably convincing special effects.


