





The Peebles Young Farmers and Wives and FFA members will co-sponsor their annual open crop and homemaking show on Monday, December 19, in the PHS Vo. Ag. Department. Judging will begin at 7:30 p.m. This show is open to everyone according to the rules as follows:

1. No entry fee will be charged
2. A person may enter every class (only one entry per class)
3. Each exhibitor must have been involved in the production of the entry during 1983

Classes include burley trash, burley lugs, burley leaf, cigar, ear corn, small grains, shelled corn, grass hay, legume hay, silage, forage seeds, and soybeans.

Homemaking classes include decorated cake, candlewicking, and "Make It Tonight" items.

Trophies will go to 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place winners of each class; and ribbons to 4th, 5th, & 6th place winners.

There will also be a special burley tobacco grading contest for everyone. There will be 15-20 hands of tobacco to be graded.





Christ the Lord.


And this shall be a sign unto you;


THE TWENTY-SIXTH OF DECEMBER

His weary feet a rest.


He has traveled to so many lands


