

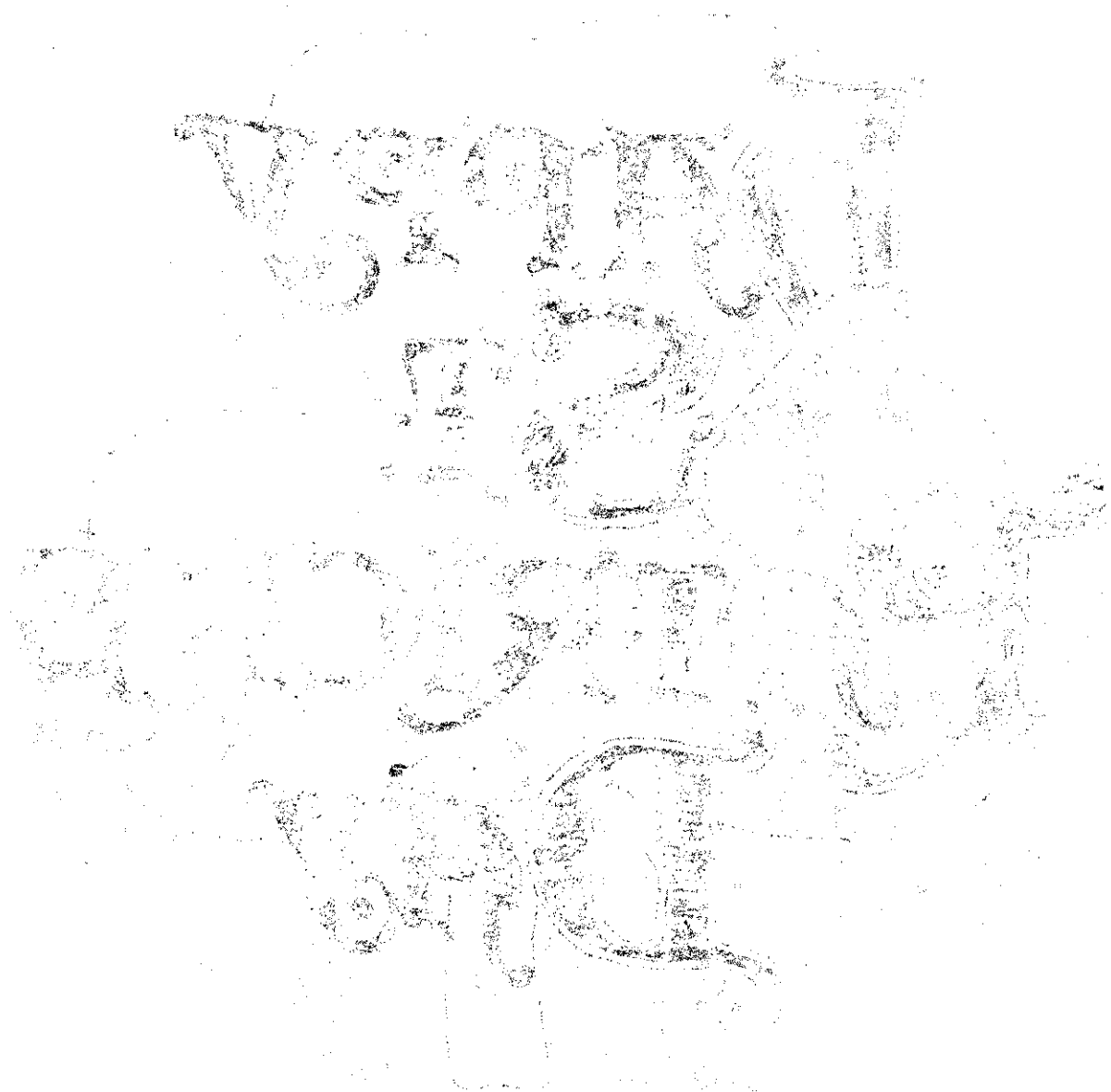

FFA CHAPTER RECEIVES AWARDS

The District 12 FFA Evaluation was held on February 9 at Eastern Brown High School. The purpose of the Evaluation is to select the top FFA Chapters in various areas of competition, select the top individual student proficiency winners, screen the State FFA Degree Candidates for final state evaluation, and rate the chapters' secretaries, treasurers, and reporters for overall quality of performance.

The Peebles Chapter received awards in all six chapter competition categories. The chapter's Overall Activities Summary was rated "Superior" and it was sent to the state level for state ranking. Peebles received the 2nd place plaque in Chapter Cooperation Activities, the 3rd place plaque in Chapter Marketing Competition, the 3rd place plaque in Chapter Tobacco Production and Promotion, the area award in Community Service, and a Superior rating in Chapter Safety projects.

Peebles Treasurer, Angie McIntosh, placed second in the District and received a Gold Rating. Chapter Secretary, Lisa Lloyd, placed fifth in the District and received a Gold Rating. Chapter Reporter, Georgia Workman, placed fifth in the District and received a Silver Rating. Bill Hemming competed in the District Tobacco Competition and he will receive a gold pin. Joe Reeves competed in the Agricultural Placement in Production category.

There are 24 FFA Chapters in District 12 and each chapter is eligible to compete in each of the awards areas.



FFA HOLDS SPEECH CONTESTS

Seven members of the Peebles FFA Chapter competed in the Chapter's Prepared Speech Contest on January 20 at Peebles High School. Each student was required to prepare a 6-8 minute speech on an agricultural topic and then defend it against questions from the judges.

The FFA Creed Contest had three members competing. First-place winner was Yvette Fristoe and she will compete at the District Level. Other placings in order included Chris McBee and Vicki Gardner.

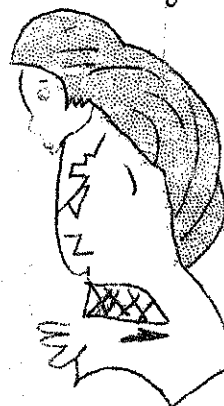

MOVIE REVIEWS

RECKLESS: Yet another tribute to teenage ennui, this is a film about loners in love--one a motorcycle tough guy, the other a jaded blonde prep. A Hackneyed theme, but crisply delivered, and a showcase for two promising "discoveries". Daryl Hannah and Aldan Quinn.
Rated: R.

WEEKEND PASS: This weekend passes by all too slowly as it subjects us to four sailors and their rampant hormones during a three-day pass.
Rated: R.

SCARFACE: Without the talents of Al Pacino and the director Brian De Palma, this would have been a so-so shoot 'em up. But Pacino makes his drug-dealing, gun wielding character something more than a trigger finger. His performance is both explosive and somehow intimate, and De Palma's violent choreography verges on the surreal.
Rated: R.

SUDDEN IMPACT: "Go ahead, make my day," says Harry, his .44 Magnum planted in a bad guy's temple. It's San Francisco's meanest cop--make that the world's meanest cop--Dirty Harry, aka Clint Eastwood, the kind of guy who'd pick a fight with Jonathan Livingston Seagull.
Rated: R.

UNFAITHFULLY YOURS: A comedy about a symphony conductor who goes crazy with jealousy over his lovely young wife; Dudley Moore plays Othello to Natassja Kinski's Desdemona. A remake of a 1948 movie and a clever adapted romantic comedy, though not nearly as witty as the original.
Rated: PG.

THE LONELY GUY: Not to be confused with "The Lonely Lady," but just about as bad. Steve Martin is tame and uninspired as the titular hermit, in search of friendship and romance in the big city.
Rated: R

STAR 80: Bob Fosse's finely wrought retelling of the tragedy of Dorothy Stratten, the Playboy model who was killed by her boyfriend. Mariel Hemingway slips into the part of Stratten with a convincing combination of glamor and innocence. A penetrating movie that rises above its sordid subject matter.
Rated: R.

FOXFIRELIGHT: A nauseating blend of those gooey romantic novel traditions featuring heroines who breathe heavily on every page but remain miraculously and forever chaste. The script was written by pulp romance queen Janet Dailey, whose stuff is just as bad on the screen as it is on the printed page.
Rated: PG.

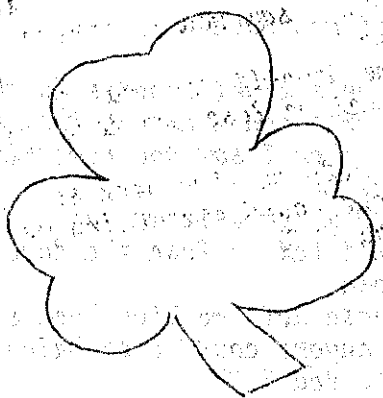

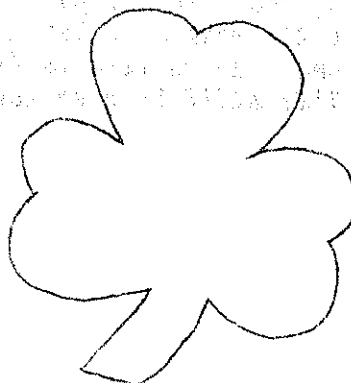
