

Peebles received the 2nd place plaque in Chapter Cooperation Activities, the 3rd place plaque in Chapter Marketing Competition, the 3rd place plaque in Chapter Tobacco Production and Promotion, the area award in Community Service, and a Superior rating in Chapter Safety projects.

Peebles Treasurer, Angie McIntosh, placed second in the District and received a Gold Rating. Chapter Secretary, Lisa Lloyd, placed fifth in the District and received a Gold Rating. RECKLESS: Vet another tribute to teenage ennui, this is a film about loners in love-one a motorcycle tough guy, the other a jaded blonde prepry. A Hackneyed theme, but crisply delivered, and a showcase for two promising "discoveries". Daryl Hannah and Aldan Quinn. Rated: R.




