The library has received several new books. These include:

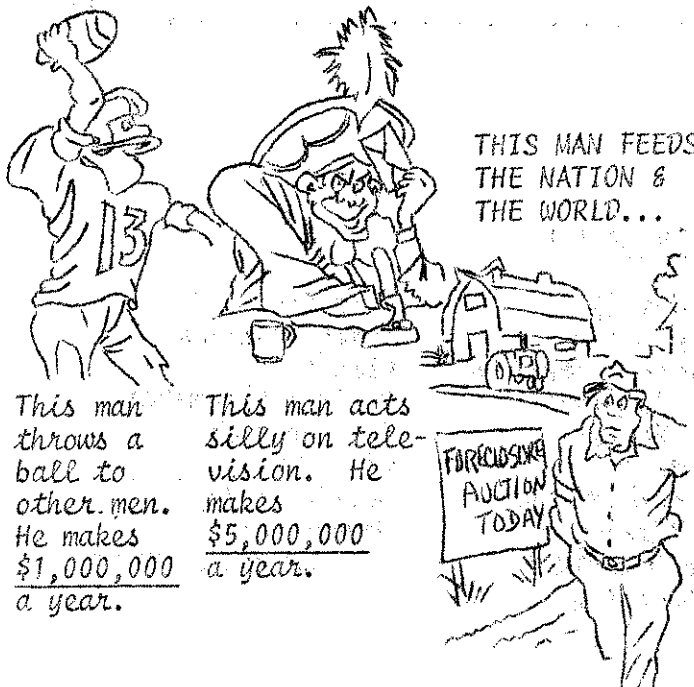

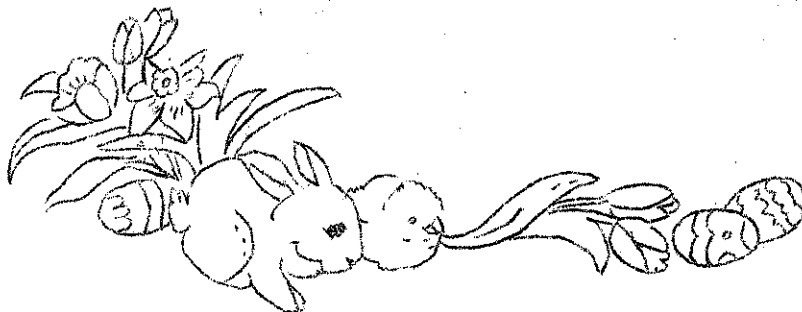
# EDITORIAL

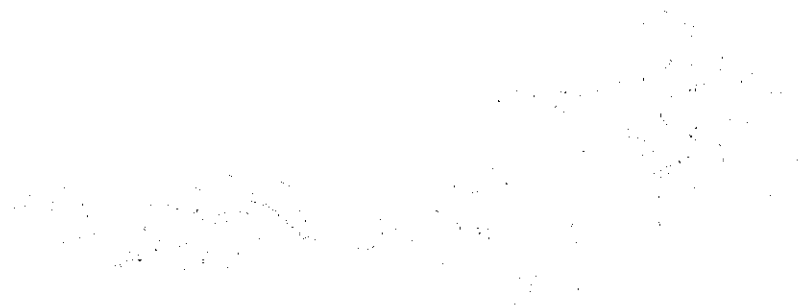

# MOVIE REVIEWS

**ANGEL:** High school student by day, Hollywood hooker by night, and boring both ways. This story about a teen tramp with a golden heart is a phony, stupid, and calculated piece of trash. rating \*(r)

**FOOTLOOSE:** The music is good, some of the dancing is okay, the plotline is mildly interesting, and the acting is credible. All those elements have been mushed together in a mindless way that effectively erases their merit and makes this a irritating piece of fluff; more like an extension of MTV than a movie. rating \*\*(pg)

**BLAME IT ON RIO:** A clever romantic comedy with a touchy theme. Michael Caine, as a sober and frustrated executive, is seduced by his best friend's teen-age daughter. A light touch and gorgeous cinematography keep this one from being sleazy; If you can handle the basic subject matter it is quite funny and, in the end, asserts its own note of morality. rating \*\*\*(r)

**LASSITER:** Basically a two-hour episode of "Magnum P. I." with Tom Selleck trapped in dapper clothing and a dismal plotline about a cat burglar who is recruited to steal diamonds from the Nazis in pre-war London. rating \*\*\*(r)

**HOUSE OF LONG SHADOWS:** An ineffective spoof of the old "House Of..." movies; rarely scary and no fun at all, even though it has horror vets Vincent Price, Christopher Lee, Peter Cushing and John Carradine in the cast. \*(PG)

**LIQUID SKY:** An exceedingly bizarre movie that makes "The Rocky Horror Show" look like "Mary Poppins." An androgynous, New Wave model lures icky lovers to her penthouse apartment in Soho, where they are zapped by an alien whose flying saucer is parked on her roof. Told you it was bizarre. rating \*\*\*\*\*(r)

**BROADWAY DANNY ROSE:** Woody Allen returns with a brassy, outrageous, sentimental, and most of all hilarious story about a small-time show business impresario with a heart of gold and a lineup of clients like you've never seen. For longtime devotees, as well as for those who wanted him to return to his earlier, funnier movies. rating \*\*\*\*\* (pg)

**THE DRESSER:** A time capsule returning us to regional theater in England during World War II, when the great tradition of the pompous and self-centered star was still in flower. With Albert Finney as the star and Tom Courtenay as his devoted manservant; both are up for the best actor Oscar and the film itself is a best picture nominee. rating \*\*\*(pg)

**UNFAITHFULLY YOURS:** A comedy about a symphony conductor who goes crazy with jealousy over his lovely young wife; Dudley Moore plays Othello to Natassja Kinski's Desdemona. A remake of a 1948 movie and a cleverly adapted romantic comedy, though not nearly as witty as the original. rating \*\*\*\*\*(pg)

May I, too, murmur, "Master, is it I?"

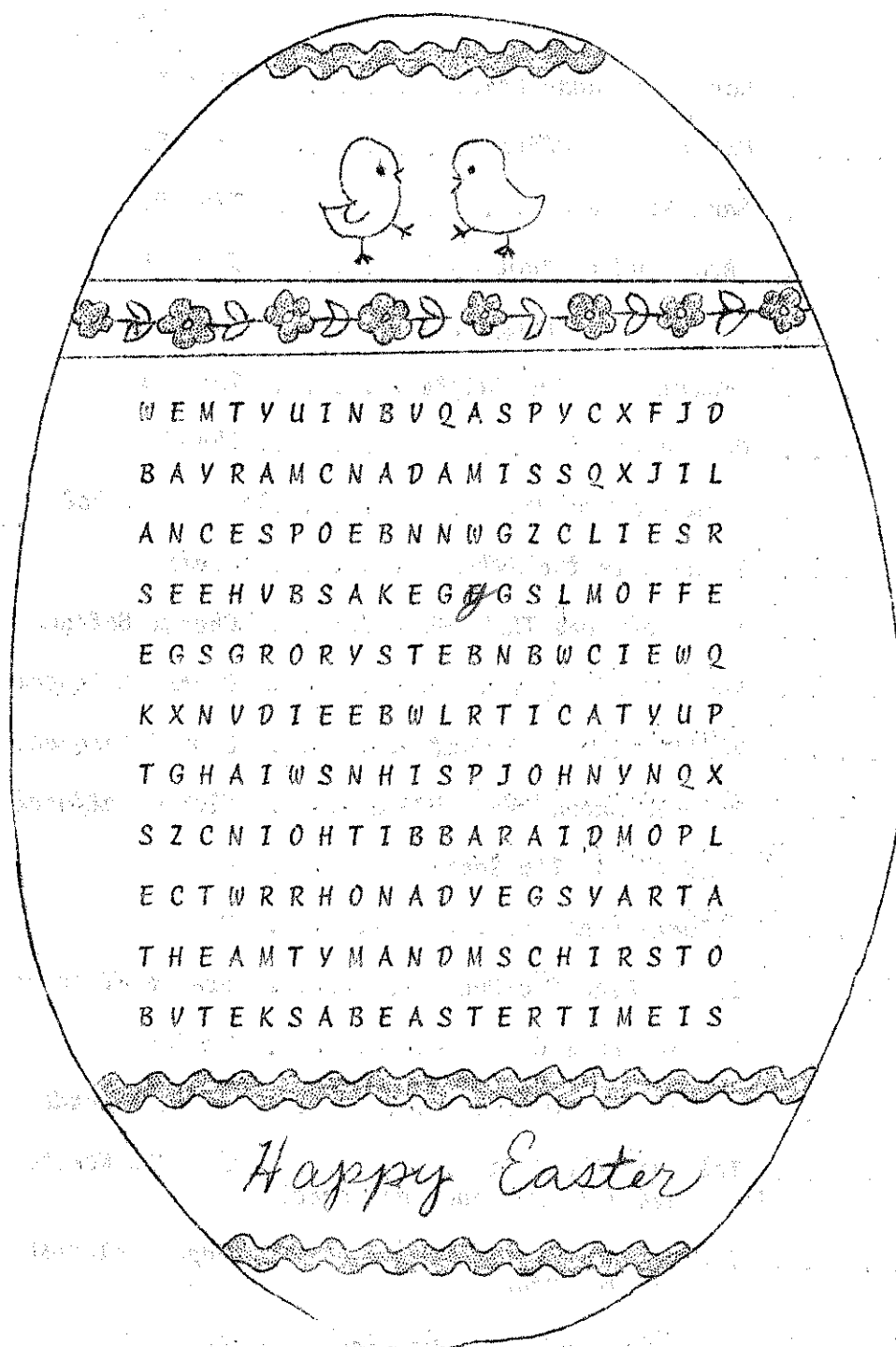
## SOME SPRING
