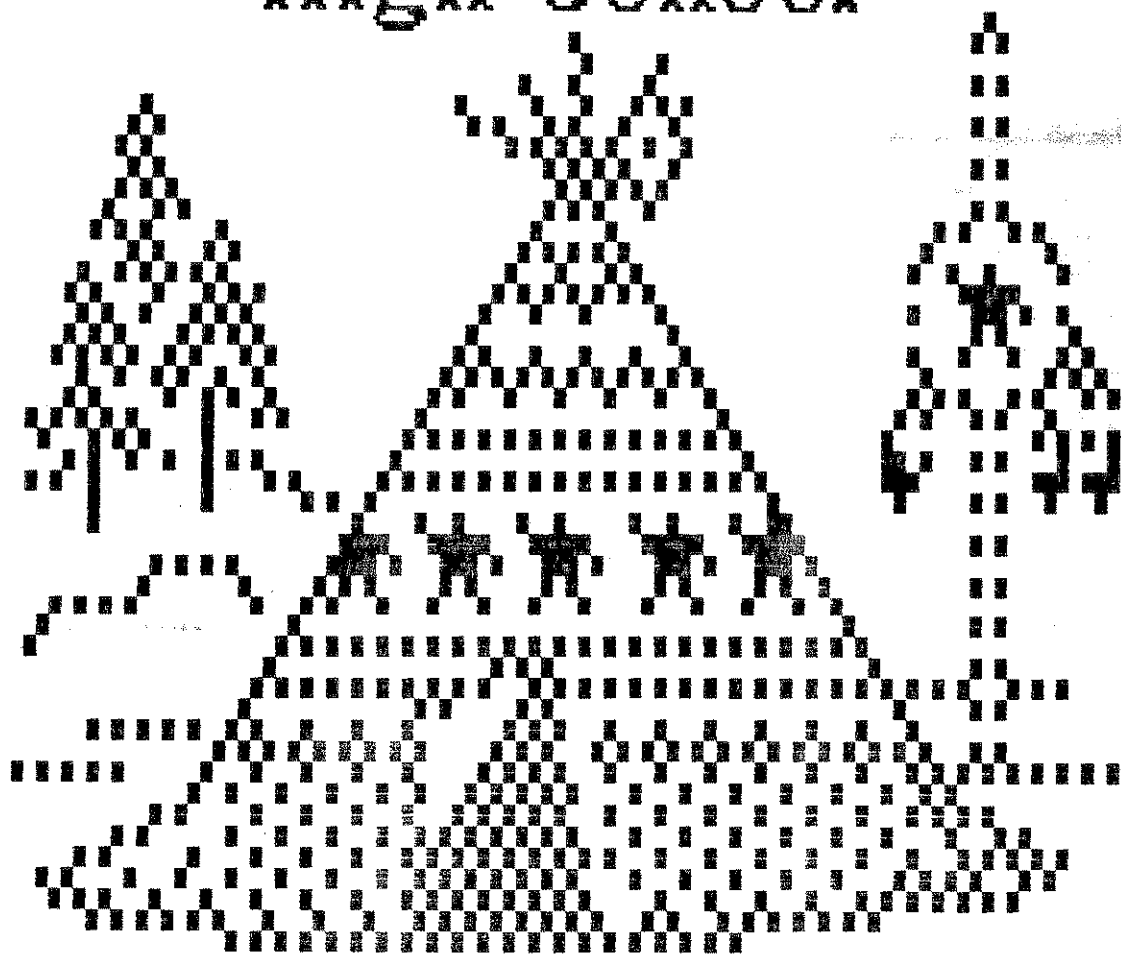

## Proficiency Test Looms in Importance

During the week of November 16th, the Ohio Proficiency Test will be given to all 9th graders as well as

those in grades 10 and 11 that have not yet passed the series of tests. All students, starting with those who were Freshmen during the 1990-91 school year, must pass all four parts of the proficiency test. Those who do not will not be able to graduate or receive a diploma. The tests are given twice each year and may be taken until a student reaches age 22. The numbers of Juniors and Sophomores who have taken the test are:

## Channel 1 Premiers at PHS

Students at PHS are using video technology as a supplement to the curriculum. The Whittle Communications of Knoxville, Tennessee is supplying TV sets to each class room in grades 7-12.

The Whittle Educational Network provides television equipment to secondary schools across the nation. Their funding is provided by the sponsors whose commercials are featured during the programs.

Our school received color TV sets, a satellite dish, and video cassette recorders. The Whittle Corporation provided wiring and maintenance of the system.

The Channel One Network has a 10 minute daily news and information program carefully designed to make news relevant to the concerns and studies of teen listeners.

Here is how it works: Each morning the news automatically is record on a VCR in the library. During homeroom, the taped program is transmitted to each TV set in each classroom from the library. The students can watch the news or a summary of a news event. What is beneficial at this time is all the election coverage we have. Students in some areas are

also featured on the news broadcast.

Another benefit of the system is that if a VCR is not available to a teacher, a videotape can be "piped into" the classroom TV set from the library.

The Channel One producers design programming to address these specific goals: to enhance cultural literacy: to promote critical thinking: to provide a common language and shared experience: to provide relevance and motivation: to strengthen character and build a sense of responsibility.

Each day a pop quiz question is asked. A few minutes later the question is answered.

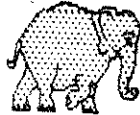

# Politics, Politics, Poitics!!!!

Just in case you haven't got your fill of campaign speeches for this election year, we present the following three editorials (in no particular order) in support of the major Presidential candidates:

## BUSH BACKER

In this election year, we as American citizens have a major choice to make. For any rational voter the choice is clear. George Bush should return as President of the United States. A hushed and somewhat dismissed issue by the press in this campaign is the character of Bill Clinton. Where

But as Ross Perot eloquently stated, just because you run a small-time grocery store doesn't mean that you can run a Wal-Mart.

Still, why vote for George Bush? The main reason is the totally opposite philosophies that the two major candidates' political parties employ. Bush (Republican) favors the principle that the government should keep out of the private sector (Laissez-Faire theory), and should not be used in an attempt to stimulate the economy. Even so, taxing the rich will inevitably funnel down to become a tax on the working middle-class.

A criticism of George Bush is that he has done nothing to help bolster our economy during his four years of office. However, many plans and bills concerned with helping our economy endorsed by Bush are immediately shot down in Congress, which has been Democratic for over thirty-eight years. And recently, on "Meet the Press", Bill Bradley (Democrat) admitted to the plan of Congress to block Bush plans to hurt his campaign and to help Clinton's. Nice campaign strategy! 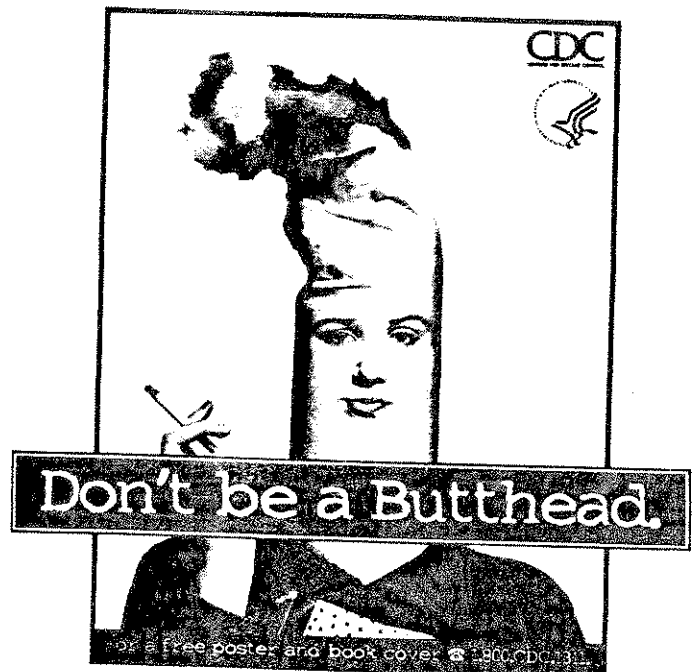

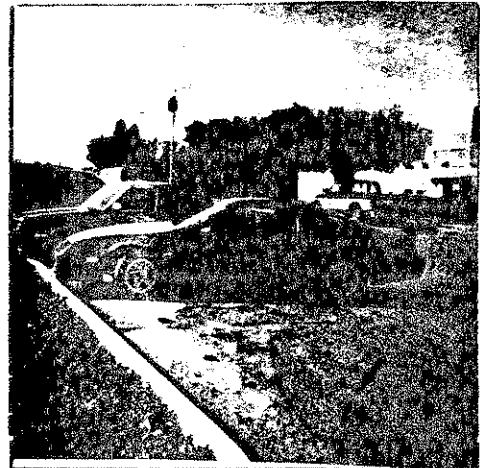

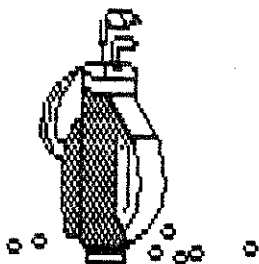

### PHS GOLF

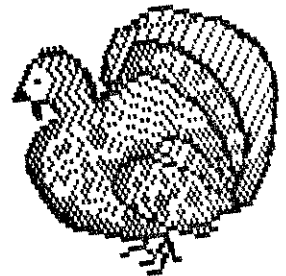

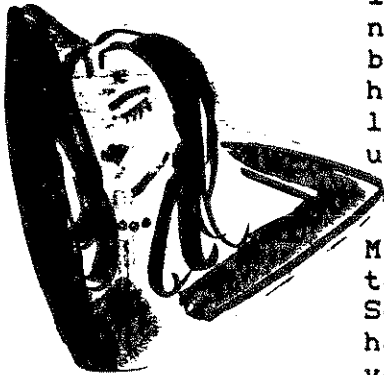
# FASHION

to my heart I have lied.

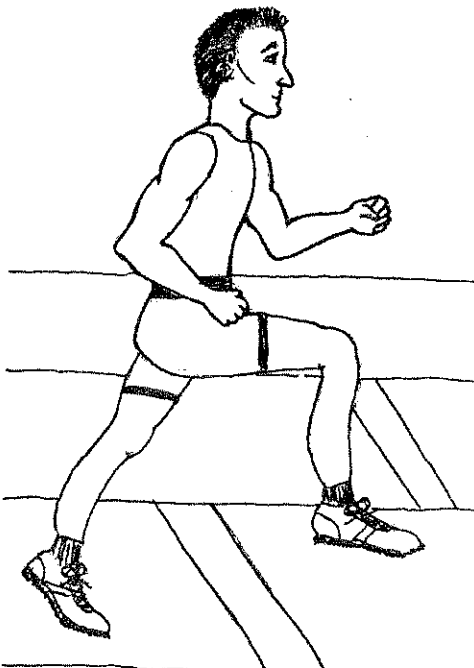
