The students and staff at Peebles High school started off the new school year with some interesting news; an e-mail letter from *Peebles Scotland* welcomed them to the Internet and invited them into a trans-Atlantic friendship. The letter was from a man named Ian Buckingham, a native of that town, and was sent in response to having found web page for *our* Peebles High School on the Internet. He explained that *his* Peebles is a small town of about 6,000, approximately 25

miles South of Edinburgh. The local school, also called Peebles High School serves about 1000 pupils ages 11-18 and is best known for their traditions in music and rugby. Mr. Buckingham, who serves on their school board, invited our local staff and students to correspond with his school; hopefully this will develop into a really great experience for both schools.

The PHS web page at this point is still very basic, primarily just announcing who we

are, where we are, and giving an e-mail address to contact for more information. The page was developed by Bill Lewis -- computer instructor at Peebles High School -- as a part of the Schoolnet Summer Technology Institute. SOCCER PROGRAM KICKS OFF WITH HIGH HOPES

It seems that all of the sports hype this year at PHS is centered around our brand-spanking new soccer program. And I do mean NEW. The person most familiar with the sport is it's coach, Mr. Krehbiel, and this is his first year coaching.

Coming from an experienced past in the sport, (winning the conference soccer championships Bethel College in Kansas), he is eager and ready to help get the new team off of the ground. When asked about what he wanted the team to accomplish, he said, "It's really too early to be thinking about winning or losing. We're just going to be worrying about having fun and learning to work together as a team."

One of the things that students are looking forward to the most about soccer is that it gives a lot of the not-so athletic students a chance to compete in a sport. When asked if he would favor any particular kind of student over another, athletic or not athletic, Coach Krehbiel responded, "That doesn't matter to me at all. The people that get to play are going to be the ones that work the hardest. The kids that I can get the most out of."

The soccer program is really more of a pilot program for next year, a lot like what boy's volleyball (which is coming back) was in 1994. There will only be competition for two weeks.

The first week, (the last of September), will be an all-county tournament for the junior high. The second, to be held the first week of October, will be a high school all-county tournament.

Boy's varsity basketball coach Brett Justice has played a large role in getting the ball rolling for the new program, which hopes to really take off when we move into the new school building next year. "The new school is going to have a soccer field, so that's when it (the soccer program) will really take off," Coach Justice said.

But getting a new athletic program off the ground is like writing a Gothic for Ms. Hohn's English class-it takes time.




