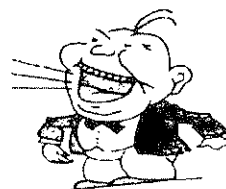
You haven't lived until you've seen Shane Milton and Jay Matheny shake their money-makers and play the trumpet at the same time.

Beauty Tips

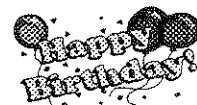

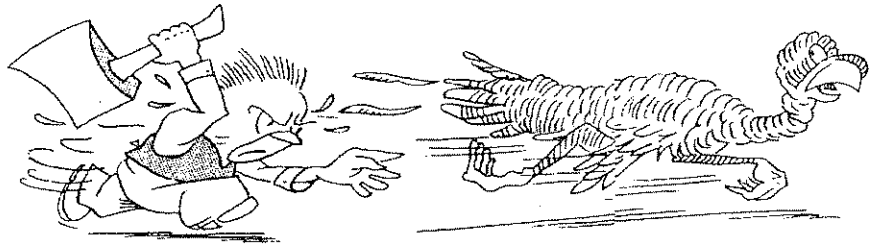
