





¿REBELLIOUS TEENS OR REBELLIOUS PARENTS?



The Peebles FFA chapter annually sells fruit to help raise money for the chapter. The money that is raised from fruit sales pays for contests, activities, banquets, and supplies for the shop and classroom that we use throughout the year. The fruit sales



are a very important part of the organization. Without funds, the program wouldn't exist. This is where the students help. Each student received an order form to take around to family, friends, neighbors, etc. to see if they would help support our FFA by buying fruit. Each student was required to sell \$400.00 worth of fruit. They began selling fruit on October 9th and set the deadline to end sales for November 13th. In one month's time, the FFA members sold 846 Boxes of Citrus, 444 Bottles of BBQ Sauce, 85 Fruit Baskets, 148 Boxes of Apples, 100 Gallons of Apple Cider and 181 Boxes of Sausage and Cheese. By the end of fruit sales, FFA members sold \$26,782.00 dollars worth of fruit and profited over \$7,300.00 dollars. Each student also had the opportunity to make some money for themselves; each

year the chapter hosts a contest and whichever student sells the most boxes of fruit wins the contest. The first place receives \$200, second-\$150, third-\$100, fourth-\$75, fifth-\$50 and sixth-tenth receive \$25 each. The top 10 sellers are listed in the column to the left.
