Corporal Lucas Christopher Scott was killed on December 3, 2010.

On Saturday December 11, 2010 hundreds of people came to show their respects to our fallen hero, Lucas Christopher Scott. People lined up from the parking lot of Peebles High School all the way into the school's gymnasium. The wait to see our American hero was over an hour long. Throughout the line of waiting played a slideshow of memories of Luke. Flowers were wrapped around the line and included was a poem "From a Mother's Heart" written by Dianna Chamblin. Luke's casket was draped with an American Flag and stood beside him was a Marine Honor Guard, following by his mother, father, brother and two sisters.

Every 15 minutes the Marine Honor Guards would switch out shifts. Every time they went to switch out, the Honor Guard coming in would stop before Luke's casket and salute him then going to the head of the casket where the stationed Marine Honor Guard stood, saluting him also. # **FOUND BY: KAILA RUDD**

## **Ingredients**

- 6 cups all-purpose flour
- I tablespoon baking powder
- I tablespoon ground ginger
- I teaspoon ground nutmeg
- I teaspoon ground cloves
- I teaspoon ground cinnamon
- I cup shortening, melted and cooled slightly
- I cup molasses
- I cup packed brown sugar
- I/2 cup water

I egg
I teaspoon vanilla extract

## **Directions**

Sift together the flour, baking powder, ginger, nutmeg, cloves, and cinnamon; set aside.

In a medium bowl, mix together the shortening, molasses, brown sugar, water, egg, and vanilla until smooth. Gradually stir in the dry ingredients, until they are completely absorbed. Divide dough into 3 pieces, pat down to 1 1/2 inch thickness,

wrap in plastic wrap, and refrigerate for at least 3 hours.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). On a lightly floured surface, roll the dough out to 1/4 inch thickness. Cut into desired shapes with cookie cutters. Place cookies I inch apart onto an ungreased cookie sheet.

Bake for 10 to 12 minutes in the preheated oven. When the cookies are done, they will look dry, but still be soft to the touch. Remove from the baking sheet to cool on wire racks. When cool, the cookies can be frosted with the icing of your choice.
