### American History Test Winner

The High School Administration and Newspaper Staff would like to extend their congratulations to Rodney Beckwith, the first Peebles High School student to win county honors on the American History Test, sponsored by Ohio University. Rodney competed against 18,000 juniors and seniors in Ohio and became one of the 338 finalists to compete in the final round of competition. He will travel to the main campus in Athens to participate on December 3. The state test will consist of three essay questions. Rodney will be notified of the final test results by January 15. If he is to win he will receive a four year scholarship to Ohio University, Athens as well as a \$100 prize.

Rodney is the son of Norman Beckwith and Sandra and Jim Pearson. He is a junior this year and, upon graduation, plans to attend college to study either computer science or history.

### NHS Scholarship Nominees

The National Honor Society Scholarship program, now in its 45th year, will provide 250 NHS members with a scholarship of \$1000.00 in 1993. Each chapter may nominate only two students for the program. Nominees must complete a seven-page application, due in February. Recipients of the scholarship will be notified in late spring.

The two nominees from the Shuman Chapter are Scott McElwee and Andy Johnson. Scott and Andy both have 4.0 g.p.a.'s, and are members of the NHS.

### NHS Collects For UNICEF

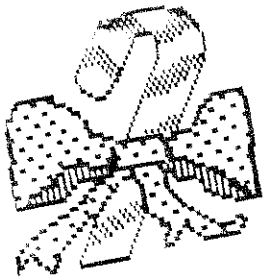
"Trick or Treat for UNICEF" (United Nations International Children's Education Fund) began in 1950 when a Philadelphia youth group, concerned over the plight of the world's children, took up door-to-door collections in empty milk cartons.

Thus began the tradition of "Children Helping Children". Over the years, the Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF campaign has raised nearly \$100 million, greatly improving the quality of life for children in the developing countries. Today, more than one million famous orange milk cartons are distributed each Halloween.

Katie Conrie, National UNICEF Day Chairperson, says that millions of children all over the world become the first victims of famine, war, economic collapse, and civil chaos. Forty-thousand children under the age of five die each day in developing countries—that's one every two-and-a-half seconds. Most die from childhood diseases that could be prevented with clean water, immunization, and basic medical care.

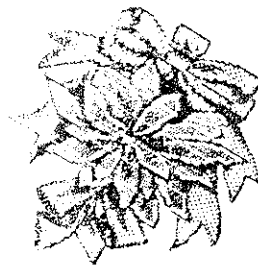

### Future Farmers of America

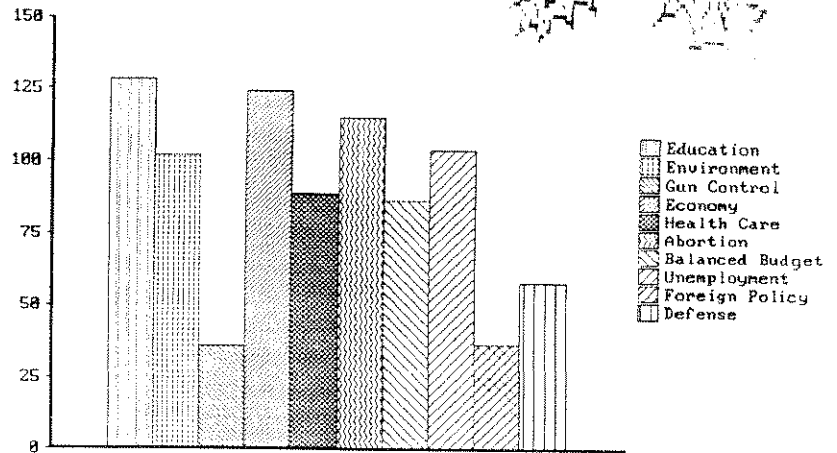

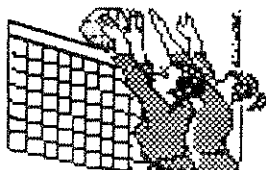

## TEACHER FEATURE

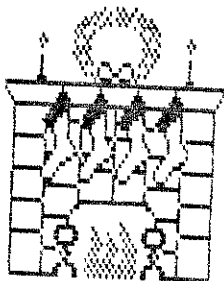

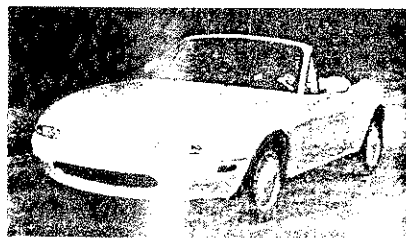
## STUDENT FEATURE

#### NURSE PRACTITIONER

A shortage of doctors in some areas and pressures on hospitals and health maintenance organizations to contain costs have thrown open the doors to nurse practitioners, who are able to treat many patients without a doctor's supervision. According to the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners, for every graduate of a nurse practitioner program an estimated four jobs beckon. Nurse practitioners typically work at clinics, nursing homes and hospitals, treating patients with chronic health problems, such as diabetes and arthritis, conducting physical exams and, in 35 states, prescribing medication. They have more independence than physician's attendants, who have similar responsibilities but must work under a doctor's supervision. Some set up their own practices, specializing in fields like pediatrics and obstetrics.

Entry: \$33,000

Midlevel: \$42,000

Top: \$50,000

#### PROS AND CONS

Nurse practitioners usually escape shift work, and they enjoy a great deal of autonomy. But many patients remain leery of not seeing a doctor.
